Home Owners, Land Owners, and Business Owners:

We would like to introduce you to the *Morrisville Fire and Rescue* Department. If you own your home, own rentals, or own land in our protection area, you need to become a member and pay yearly dues for free calls to your property. For our current members, this is your official annual dues notice. Our service area is south of Y Highway on the east side of Highway 13 and south of East 473rd on the west side of Highway 13. Our east border is South 180th road and our west border is the Sac River and South 70th road to Greene County line.

Morrisville Fire and Rescue responds to fires, motor vehicle accidents, and medical calls. We have four stations throughout our service area to make our response time shorter. We also have three fire engines, three brush trucks, two rescue vehicles, and three water tankers. In addition, **Emergency Medical Technicians** and **First Responders** are certified for medical and rescue calls. Our fire fighters are trained in structure and wildfires as well as auto rescue.

Inside the City of Morrisville is a class 5 ISO rating. Outside the city is a class 6 ISO rating. An ISO rating is how insurance companies base their customers' premium. To receive these ratings **you must be a paid member** of Morrisville Fire and Rescue. Please try to have your membership dues in by March.

As a member who pays yearly dues, you will receive no charge for calls to your property. A typical medical call can cost in the range of \$380.00. An average fire call can cost \$4500.00, and an auto accident can cost around \$1000.00. Depending on the incident, these amounts can vary significantly. Becoming a member is a very cost effective measure and affords you some peace of mind. A lifetime membership fee is \$30.00, yearly dues are \$60.00 for first property and \$35.00 for each additional rental or property in our area. Business yearly dues are \$100.00 per year.

Please note: If you live inside the City of Morrisville, you are **NOT** automatically a member of *Morrisville Fire and Rescue*. You **MUST** join by paying the initial fee and the annual dues. The City of Morrisville provides only water and hydrants. *Morrisville Fire and Rescue* is a separate **NON-TAX based, Not for Profit, MEMBER SUPPORTED**, fire and rescue service organization.

While there is a proposed tax district on the upcoming April election, this tax would not take effect until 2016 if passed, so there will be no double billing for 2015 regardless of the election results. We will send a copy of your ISO rating with your paid receipt for your insurance company.
